1. Conflict & Repair Dialogue

• Three to ten is the average number of sessions per referral. Each session is 1 - 2 hours in length.

• Conflict & Repair dialogue is a facilitated process used to address a specific conflict or patterns of conflict between two or more people that centers around restoring healthy relationships versus establishing "right" and "wrong." Conflict & Repair dialogue is a voluntary, collaborative form of communication and problem-solving. This service begins with the provider having one-on-one meetings with each party before a joint session can take place. Participants may: explore patterns of communication that stem from and result in fractured relationships, resolve long-standing differences, and learn to receive the concerns and feelings of others and empathize with their needs.

2. Family Circles

• There are no maximum or minimum number of Family Circles per referral. Family Circles can involve multiple family members. Each session lasts 1.5 to 2 hours.

• Family Circles provide a process for bringing two or more family members together as equals to talk about difficult issues in an atmosphere of respect. The intent of a Family Circle is to speak honestly about how each person is being impacted by one another, to seek mutual understanding, and to create agreements that serve every member. The process is based on an assumption of equal worth and dignity for all participants. Family Circles offer the opportunity to address and process harm, violence, misunderstandings, or long-standing conflict; or they may focus more on teaching and practicing tools. Each Family Circle is custom designed to meet each family's needs.

3. Grief Support Services

• Individual sessions are typically 1 - 2 hours in length.

• Grief Support Services can help people find meaning, value, and restored hope in the midst of suffering (or after incidents of grief and loss have occurred), even if the suffering itself cannot be removed. You and your provider can explore the feelings and thoughts and behaviors associate with losses and identify the innate strengths you possess that will support your healing. Grief Support Services help people adjust to their "changed" life, recognize the impacts that loss has left in its wake, and begin the process of rebuilding by learning tools and strategies to cope and process feelings and experiences.

TEAM Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) is an outpatient, action oriented and skills based form of psychotherapy that is e?ective for individuals struggling with depression, anxiety, relationship problems, and unwanted habits and substance use concerns (Butler, et. al., 2006; Hofmann, et. al., 2012). Services are provided exclusively via HIPAA compliant video platform and are based on the pioneering work of Dr. David Burns, MD (see https://feelinggood.com). Team CBT is provided by Eric Diamond, a Milwaukee based Licensed Clinical Social Worker and Level 4 Certi?ed TEAM CBT Clinician with 17 years experience as a direct practice clinician and leader in County and non-pro?t mental health systems. TEAM CBT is now available for adults and adolescents.

Course of Treatment & Expectations:

A course of TEAM CBT includes Dr. Burns's recommended framework, using Testing, Empathy, Agenda Setting, and his vast collection of CBT Methods within each therapeutic session. TEAM CBT, like traditional Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, helps individuals change the way they think, the way they communicate, and other aspects of their lives so they can feel better and recover. Sessions are structured to allow individuals ample opportunity to practice a number of powerful methods to e?ectively address their depression, anxiety, relationship problems, unwanted habits and substance use concerns.

A course of TEAM CBT includes the following services:

-Video based psychotherapy provided via Zoom for Healthcare, a HIPAA and HITECH compliant platform.

-Empathetic, motivational, action oriented, and skill building sessions with Eric based on Dr. Burns's model.

-After care relapse preparation sessions to ensure individuals are able to sustain the helpful skills and methods, implementing them into their day to day.

-Optional phone and video based therapeutic check-ins across the week.

-Team meetings with recovery team members as needed.

-Clinical supervision with other recovery team members to ensure excellent clinical outcomes.

Session length and course of treatment may vary depending on the needs of the client, but generally, TEAM CBT is delivered in 1.5 to 2 hour sessions, with a typical course lasting between eight to ten weeks. Session length can also be adapted to meet particular insurance payer requirements and/or the preferences of the people served. TEAM CBT can also be adapted for individuals with multiple and complex challenges who may require longer term care.

Who Bene?ts from TEAM CBT?

TEAM CBT can be helpful for a diverse set of individuals with a number of challenges. Individuals who struggle with depression, anxiety, relationship problems, and/or unwanted habits and substance use concerns can use TEAM CBT to achieve their goals and forward their recovery.

TEAM CBT is an action oriented therapy, and includes opportunities for individuals to practice helpful methods in session. Like with any new skill, the more practice with the method, the greater the success using it. TEAM CBT works best when individuals are willing to complete psychotherapy homework between sessions. Homework may include reading book chapters, listening to podcasts, as well as a host of written and community based exercises. Individuals who are motivated to keep developing their skills by practicing methods in between sessions have the most success.

Service Description EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

EmployAbility provides one-one-one employment support services to help people find and sustain employment in the competitive market. Services include career exploration, customized job searching, employer outreach, new job training support, and help maintaining employment. Our Employment Specialists provided comprehensive support during the job search process that includes client-directed career exploration which can include job shadows with the goal being that the person can utilize their current strengths and abilities to secure employment without the need for additional training or education. We also work cooperatively with consumers to develop resumes and cover letters that are effective but also use the consumer's voice. Our goal is to not only help people find employment but give them the tools to be more effective in their own job search so, we also provide training on how to search for and apply to positions. When appropriate we also reach out to employers utilizing a strengths perspective to advocate for consideration for a posted job opening or to create a custom job based on the skills and abilities of the consumer.

Interview preparation services include mock interviews, preparing for competency-based interview questions, and attending interviews with consumers when appropriate. Our Employment Specialists are also equipped to provide insight into what different employers/industries are seeking in an employee in order to provide customized preparation for specific interview locations.

Upon accepting an offer of employment, we can provide any additional support to sustain the job. This support may include on-site job coaching, reasonable accommodation request assistance, advocacy, and mediation. There are no time constraints on these services and consumers can receive this these retention services at any point regardless of whether or not EmployAbility helped them obtain the job or how long they have been employed.

We also provide guidance to help people understand how working may impact a person's benefits (SSI/DI, Foodshare, Medicaid, Sec. 8/42 housing, etc.) and work with them to make sure they are complying with any wage report requirements for those benefits.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT

EmployAbility can provide a wide variety of support to assist people in their mental health recovery and work towards greater independence in their community. Skill development is most often facilitated in a consumer's home or community and support can take many forms. The most common types of support that consumers request include computer and smart phone literacy, organizational skills and financial literacy.

Disability Application Assistance - ERI offers people help in applying for disability benefits such as Social Security Administration Programs: Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) and Supplemental Security Income (SSI), as well as Medicaid and FoodShare programs. This service assists people with completing application forms and follow up questionnaires, provides education about the steps and agencies involved, and supports people throughout the application process until an eligibility determination is made.

Work Incentives Benefits Counseling - Through benefits counseling, ERI provides education about various public benefits (e.g. SSDI, SSI, Medicaid, and Medicare Savings Programs), and the effects of work on various public benefits. We work together with people to build a better understanding of work incentives, program rules, and how earnings may affect the person's disability payments and other benefits. Benefits counseling enables people to make informed decisions about starting work, and over time, assists the person when employment or career goals change.

Pre-Driving Assessment - ERI's hands-on driving simulator enables clients to test and practice driving skills. Our Driving Services Specialist provides objective feedback about measured abilities such as decision-making, reaction time, attentiveness, memory, and problem-solving. This information helps people to determine their interest and potential in moving forward with driving training and getting a driver's license.

ERI partners with the client and CCS Service Facilitator agencies to provide Individual Placement and Support (IPS) services. IPS supported employment services involve a partnership between the client, the CCS Service Facilitation agency, the ERI Employment Specialist, and DVR.

With training and certification in many kinds of yoga, I offer various yoga styles: gentle hatha yoga, energetic flow yoga, yoga from sitting in chairs, meditative yin yoga, adaptive yoga, yoga for arthritis, and vocal yoga.

I center each of these yoga styles in the core trauma healing practices of TCTSY, exploring and developing skills that support healthy relationship with oneself and others (invitation, choice, taking effective action, sharing authentic experience, attunement and agency), and skills that strengthen healthy connections within the nervous system (interoception/body awareness, present-moment focus, and attending to a sense of time through rhythms or countdowns).

I also offer practices from the Community Resiliency Model (CRM) a non-yoga body-centered approach to working with trauma and developing resiliency in the autonomic nervous system, developed by Elaine Miller Karas at the Trauma Resource Institute. CRM can be especially helpful for people whose physical mobility is more limited, or who don't feel ready or interested in trying TCTSY. It can also be used to develop a complementary set of mental health skills, for those who want to combine it with a TCTSY practice.

While TCTSY and CRM are used especially to alleviate anxiety, depression and trauma, I work together with each person to help them create an individualized practice that addresses their needs holistically, shaped by their emotional and physical experiences, needs, and goals.

I'm happy to work with people of various ages, cultures, experiences and identities, and offer TCTSY and CRM sessions in English, Spanish, or bilingually.

SOAR Case Management, Inc. is a consumer operated non-profit, recovery based provider of community mental health services. SOAR was founded in 1997 on the belief that mental health consumers can and will recover if they are given the tools to become self-sufficient and follow their hopes and dreams. SOAR's mission is to assist consumers in developing their capabilities, talents, and aspirations in a culturally responsive, trauma-informed, and recovery oriented manner. SOAR's approach to case management has always put a strong emphasis on peer support as a primary component of the service delivery continuum. Currently the majority of SOAR's staff identify as mental health consumers. Furthermore, 100% of SOAR's Board of Directors identify as mental health consumers. This in-depth understanding of the mental health and substance use systems, both from a consumer and clinician stance, ensures that consumers at SOAR remain the drivers of their own treatment and recovery.

SOAR Programs:

Case Management: At its core, SOAR's Service Facilitation services rely on the principles of self- determination, autonomy, empowerment, respect, and collaboration to tailor individualized community based treatment for adults living with mental health and substance use issues. Our solution-focused, holistic approach to case management puts consumers first and understands that each person is the "expert" of their own experience. Our case managers seek to understand the unique life experiences, successes, and challenges of each consumer and work in a culturally responsive, trauma informed manner with consumers on their recovery journey. Service Facilitators work to coordinate and provide a wide array of office and community based services including:

-Housing Support/Assistance -Crisis Management -SSA Benefit Management -Psychiatry Referral/Coordination -Physical/Dental Health Needs -Individual and Group Therapy/Counseling Services -Medication Management -Peer Support Services -Daily Living Skills -Money Management

Psychiatry Clinic: SOAR's DHS CH. 35 Outpatient Psychiatry Clinic provides prescriber services to individuals in Madison and the surrounding Dane County Area who are living with mental illness and/or substance use concerns and are either enrolled in CCS or who have Medicaid (MA or MA with Care WI or iCare HMO's). Our Psychiatrist works directly with our consumers and their case managers in a collaborative, holistic manner to work to find creative solutions to individual challenges and concerns. Within our prescriber services SOAR offers medication management, diagnostic/psychiatric evaluations, and psychotherapy. Additionally, consumers have access to RN services including lab monitoring, medication assistance/administration, and basic physical health monitoring.

Recovery Dane: Recovery Dane provides community based Certified Peer Specialist services in one-on--one or groups settings. Our Wisconsin certified peers have the ability to lend unique insights and support to consumers living with mental illness and substance use concerns. SOAR sees Peers as an integral part of consumers treatment team during their recovery journey. Recovery Dane offers peers who are bilingual in Spanish and English as well as a peer who publically identifies as transgender.

Peer Lead Groups: Recovery Dane and Solstice House peers also facilitate multiple weekly groups including Coping with Anxiety and Depression, Hearing Voices, Writing your Way to Wellness, Radiance--peer support for transgender and non-binary people seeking mental health support, and are currently developing new offerings.

Solstice House: Solstice House opened in 2015 and is one of the three original Peer Run Respites in Wisconsin. Solstice House aims to provide a stable and supportive home-like environment run by, and for, individuals with lived experiences of mental health and/or substance use concerns. It provides short--term, residential support for individuals who may be experiencing an increase in symptoms or life stressors who are in need of support and services to aid in their overall recovery and wellness. Solstice House also offers a "Warm line" service to any Wisconsin Resident in need of telephonic or Zoom based peer support services. Warmline will be changing in 2022/23 with the implementation of the Statewide Warmline, in which Solstice House has played an integral part of planning and will provide services within.

SOAR is working toward physical health monitoring as defined in the CCS service array with a focus on education for management of physical health conditions acerbated by mental illness. We plan to employ a part-time RN for the purpose of providing training and assistance to the CCS consumer to identify symptoms of physical health conditions, monitoring of physical health medications and treatments, and the development of skills related to monitoring and management of physical health concerns with the consumer and family members as identified by the consumer.
