HANDBOOK HIGHLIGHT

Ongoing Training requirements page 33 of the <u>handbook</u>



All crisis service providers are required to receive at least 8 hours of ongoing training per calendar year, beginning the year after their year of hire.

Relevant topics

- Providing emergency mental health services
- Rules and procedures relevant to the DCPN
- Compliance with applicable state and federal regulations
- Cultural competency in mental health services
- Current issues in client's rights and services.



Did you know?

DCPN provides useful templates to help document training. These can be found at <u>https://providers.dcdhs.com/DCPN</u>. 2024 ongoing training is required for all crisis service providers who started in their positions before 1/1/2024, and must be completed by 12/31/2024. These 8+ hours of training are in addition to any training that may still be needed to demonstrate that initial orientation training requirements were met.

Staff who also provide other community mental health service types (e.g. CCS) may apply relevant training hours for those service types toward this requirement, but documentation must be submitted separately for each service type.

Please ensure that you keep initial orientation and ongoing training records for each staff member. All training records may be requested at any time by either Dane County Human Services or by Journey Mental Health



PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT

Dane County Care Center (DCCC) Treatment Readiness Center (TRC)

DCCC is a short-term stabilization program that provides 24/7 support in a residential setting to help avoid the need for a higher level of care. TRC is a medically monitored withdrawal management program that provides supervision and support as individuals stop using substances and prepare for treatment.

Types of Services

- Clinical Case Management
 - Assessment and treatment planning
 - Assessing risk and safety planning
 - Housing Referrals
 - Connection to ongoing providers therapy, peer support, case management, psychiatry, primary care
- Activity groups
- Connection to insurance, food share, other benefits
- Completion of ASAMs and connection to AODA treatment
- > Prescriber services on select days for some individuals
- Peer Support
- 3 psychoeducational groups daily
- Nursing on site 40 hours/week



- Intoxication Monitoring
- Withdrawal Management, including comfort medications as indicated
- Individual Assessment and treatment planning
- Referral to RSUD treatment, MAT services and/or peer support
- Naltrexone (Vivitrol) initiation
- Group Recovery Sessions
- On-Site support meetings (AA/NA)

Did you know?

Individuals who are referred / present at DCCC with intoxication or risk or withdrawal may be diverted for a short stay at TRC for monitoring prior to admission





PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT

Dane County Care Center Treatment Readiness Center (DCCC) (TRC)

Eligibility and Access

- Must have Medicaid or be uninsured. Long Term Care consumers not eligible.
- Must have a behavioral health crisis need meeting Medicaid billing criteria.
- Must be a Dane County resident OR someone living in and intending to stay in Dane County but who does not meet residency requirements.
- Must have Medicaid, Medicare or be uninsured
- Must be a Dane County resident
- Must be seeking SUD treatment and have an immediate need to be in a medically monitored environment
- Must not be seeking withdrawal management for barbiturates, benzodiazepines, or methadone



Referrals

To make a referral, call 608-224-2500 extension 6 to reach the admissions team. Outside of business hours, use extension 1 to reach staff on the unit. Please note at time of referral there will be questions about nature of crisis, symptoms, care team, medication, medical conditions, substance use, anticipated discharge plan and location.

To make a referral, call the Detox facility main number at 608-223-3311. Be prepared to provide information (as available) about the consumer's current use and use history, medications, medical conditions, history of withdrawal, treatment needs and preferences, SUD bed date (if applicable)

Hours of Operation: 24/7

Cost: Free of charge for those funded by Dane County.

Cost varies for commercial insurance

Length of Stay: Varies for Dane County residents. Non-

residents maximum is 3 nights.
