



## **Disability Determination**

The Disability Determination Bureau (DDB) makes decisions for Wisconsin residents applying for disability benefits.

- Both Medical and Work information is considered in the disability determination for adults.
- Eligibility for SSI and SSDI uses the same disability determination process.
- A disability determination through Social Security will meet the disability requirement for many other programs.



## Social Security Appeals Someone who is found not to have a disability by Social Security's standards (denied eligibility) can appeal this decision. Denial notice has important information about next steps if someone chooses to appeal, including timeframe information. There is a 60-day limit to file an appeal. Good cause may be granted if someone misses the deadline, but it's at Social Security's discretion. These appeals can be requested online: https://www.ssa.gov/forms/ssa-561.html





